1. Chairwoman's Opening Remarks and Welcome

The Chair welcomed everyone to July's management meeting. She thanked all that helped at the Royal Lancs show, a successful weekend which raised approximately £200. Congratulations to all who competed at Field Day, came home with selection of prize card, including first place gurning. Congratulations to those who competed nationally for Dairy Stockjudging, special note for Liv Gorst who placed second in under 21's. Congratulations to Lucy Robinson who competed in Situations Vacant nationally and placed fifth.

3. Minutes of the last Management Meeting as circulated

a. Matters arising from the minutes not covered on the agenda

4. Correspondence (H Rose)

Meeting with Leoni Purdy of RABI, she is the maternity cover for our area. She is planning on attending the September meeting to talk about what we can do with them moving forward and rejuvenating the relationship.

Contacted by Smelt Mill staff about promoting their outdoor centre. It is run by Bowland Pennine Mountain Rescue. They can host weekend groups with 2 team members, do self-catering or pay for food, have 30 beds in bunk rooms. They provide team building activities, climbing and other games. They offer a mountain rescue challenge weekend with activities around principles of mountain rescue ending in a rescue simulation.

Prices were confirmed as follows:

Can offer activities on an evening. 2-night self-catering weekend, no activities provided - £840. If activities are provided there is an extra charge of £140 per instructor

For a non-residential weekend. We have a policy that all weekend bookings are to be charged at the standard rate of a full 2-night residential weekend i.e. £840 unless very short notice booking.

A single day midweek would be £130 per day.

An evening midweek would be £65.

Catering can be provided but there will need to be advanced notice so we can arrange this.

Thought perhaps a little pricey considering users from LFYFC would not live that far from the venue but perhaps offered good option for evening meeting activity option for clubs nearby.

Lancaster Uni and requested support for funding application support. Contacted by a team from the university who are applying for funding to run a project aiming to address the cultural barriers affecting youth participation in agriculture and design practical interventions that can empower the next generation of farmers in the UK and Indonesia. They want a letter of support from us by 4th Aug. Our involvement would be requested in terms of them wanting to talk to young farmers in the area, possible use of land for activities and there would be opportunities for an exchange with Indonesian farmers.

There are some concerns, primarily that they have put together a project centred around young farmers without talking to us first (are the aims based on assumptions?) and now are approaching for our support with a very short deadline. Rang national office to speak to Sarah Palmer (AGRI) about this, and she shared my concerns and also stated that there are lots of people doing quite similar projects – will it tell us anything new. Sarah has submitted a very general letter of support.

It was felt that it was very short notice to give support for something for which there was very little information and some concern that we would be dragged into something with very little benefit to the young farmers of Lancashire. It was agreed that Hannah would submit a general support letter similar to that from NFYFC, but would not promise any assistance without further information.

Daisybeck Studios regarding a CBBC proposal. Hannah read they email received:

I'm a Development Researcher at Daisybeck Studios who have made many farming/animal shows for Channel 5 including The Yorkshire Vet, Springtime on the Farm, Winter on the Farm, Our Great Yorkshire Life and have made children's shows for Milkshake! such as Animal Care Club and Show Me How.

We have recently been chatting with commissioners at CBBC who are interested in making a new show based around the lives of young farmers.

After seeing the Clitheroe club being spotlighted as Club of the Month in March 2025, I thought it would be great to see if you would be open to chat about featuring one of the groups within your county to follow their lives as young farmers on their family farms and within the club.



The idea of the show is to be as authentic as possible and to celebrate our young farmers as they juggle the daily lives of school, work and their farm whilst also having fun and getting involved in club activities. I would love to know if this is something you would be interested in chatting more about this as we think it would be a great way for other children who don't belong to farming communities to learn what it entails from children and young adults themselves.

Initial feelings are that this seems to be a little more wholesome than some of the requests that have come through. Hannah asked if Officers could relay this info to younger club members and let her know if anyone is interested. She will also put it in the weekly update.

Compass fuels would like to do a photo presentation at the office with a big cheque for the money raised at Great Eccleston Show. It would be during the day on a weekday.

Ana will come over from work and Ella would be happy to come over from the Auction.

5. MooHundred Club (H Rose)

Proposal prepared and circulated prior to the meeting for discussion. Hannah read the proposal.

£12 per number proposed, as this is what had been charged previous. There was also a suggestion to increase to 15. There was a discussion about affordability and how there was some disparity between what older generations and active members could afford. It was agreed to keep it at £12 per number for now and review again in a year after launch. The proposed schedule for the draws (and them taking place at the management meetings) was agreed.

Hannah will progress getting the system set up for launching. The trustees will progress getting access to the MooHundred bank account so the finances can be managed for the new system and those who paid previously be managed appropriately. Hannah will secure the licence.

b. Financial Report

The accounts for year-end have been submitted and circulated. A quick overview shows donations and legacies are down (could be due to lack of staff), investment and income is down to £59,000 from £87,000 last year.

Charitable activities increased from £76,000 to £83,000 giving a loss of £21,000. Membership was down significantly, and this might be an explanation, along with the roof repair.

Any questions or comments?

Gary commented that it struck him that if you look at accounts from last year there is a £30,000 difference. One of things we can do is to generate money through donations. Apparently, this is in staff members' remit but is in the remit of all members. He urged all members to be looking at raising money to cover running large events. He suggested the Chairman's Challenge could be organised to raise money as well. Donations should not be sole job of staff.

Alice Bradley suggested the list of sponsorship activities could be sent round, so club members could approach businesses near them to see if they would be happy to take us up on any.

Ana mentioned that sponsorship was secured to cover most of NA weekend.

Sue mentioned the trustees reviewed the accounts and were concerned by overall loss but, could see how this came about. They are looking at the Finance Officer role but would like to understand what members think should be reported at management meetings. She noted we have got out of the habit of reporting finances and would be good to have the updates throughout the year.



She asked officers if they were worried about what is in the bank? It was suggested that the report should include a rolling amount in bank and a summary of what has been spent and coming in, that it should be modelled on a quarterly business report.

It was relayed that Hannah would be doing Xero training early August.

Members asked to email Hannah if they know anyone out of age who might be interested in Finance Officer role.

Hannah will provide some finance report templates to review at next meeting so can decide on a final report version

8. Social, Fundraising and Training Committee (M Whittle/E Mason)

Made just over £1,000 at Great Eccleston Show. Need some more volunteers for this show and looking at doing again with Compass Fuels next year. Would like 2 people per club to get involved next time so we can make money.

Royal Lancashire was quite low on numbers of helpers and last minute on securing the final people who will help again. Will review this show at the next meeting, if we commit to doing it again, could we get some bigger space?

Looking for ideas around a New Years Eve party proposal at Lancashire Auction Mart to raise money. The Mart have offered a marquee and £300 donation. Already looking at the licence options and thinking about £60 per ticket with food and drink at additional cost.

First aid training will be organised.

Silo training will be organised September/ October for new Officers.

Meeting was held at same time as Comps committee meeting and more people turned up, venue worked better but was a bit loud. Traders Arms was suggested as it is very close but has a separate room and it was agreed will trial this venue for the September meeting.

b. Management Trustees (A Holden)

Meeting was held 15th July, and it was confirmed the new photocopier and alarm have now been installed. The terms of reference for sub committees and structure of organisation are out for review and will be shared with sub committees. It is hoped theses will now focus on responsibilities. Trustees reviewed the finance report. They are still keen still to get a Finance Officer but want to get the accounts for this financial year done very soon after year end and then have clean handover to new person in post. Jess is resigning as now has 4 children, so they are looking for secretary for trustees, needs to be out of membership age, but if anyone knows of someone who might be interested, please let a trustee know. There was a discussion on office maintenance and repairs, it was agreed there was nothing pressing. Andrea Gardner involved at Myerscough raised an issue as at county rally had some suggestions for next time and was disappointed with rubbish left and that ran out of food. She will send in letter but felt helpful to improve moving forward and when letter comes in could share at committee meetings. Needs some accounts at trustees moving forward, It was agreed the next meeting would be earlier so that the end of year accounts can be reviewed and a date will be set for September.

James would like to step down in January. Will need a new post holder, preferably with experience and out of age. If anyone suitable is known please suggest them (Ana, Anna, Trustees).

12. County Office Report (H Rose)

Grounds – Thanks were given to Simon who has kindly cleared a section out the front and moved the branches left by the people who installed the new Auction Mart fencing. A question as to what the officers would like to do about the grounds moving forward. Options were discussed in terms of what was required and the frequency. Ella Mason will be following up with her brother, if this is not an option Hannah will consult the Auction Mart and make arrangements for the company they use to also do ours.

Ant infestation – There was an issue with an ant's nest under the window of the main office within the building. This has now been dealt with.

New alarm has been fitted and is operational. The cameras are in-situ and working. Some teething problems with the use of the fobs and this will be monitored. There is now a function where the alarm can be remotely operated from an app on the LFYFC phone, which means that access to the building is not reliant on knowing a code and members can call Hannah to sort the alarm and get the code for the keys to gain access much easier than previous.

Room hire – we have a long-term hirer of the smaller meeting room with the understanding that we may still need use of the room on occasion. His name is Thomas Lemmon, and he is a councillor/ therapist. A hire agreement is with trustees for approval and hopefully the arrangement will go well.

New photocopier – machine has been installed and is operational. Hannah is currently building a webpage to offer community printing at low prices that will still make us a profit. Clubs will get printing at cost price but based on all of Bolton-by-Bowland's Rounders printing only coming to about 11p, clubs will only be



invoiced once the charge goes above £1. The printer is able to produce booklets, pamphlets and flyers to a high standard. Contact Hannah if any more info is needed.

Carrs Billington Foundation - we were sadly unsuccessful in receiving the funding, feedback has been requested.

Silo – has a new look! Members can now earn member badges for achievements that can be tracked through Silo. 24/25 membership will close 4th Aug. County membership is currently at 593. All clubs are urged to sort their membership by this date otherwise we will lose our dual representation at NA and National level. Memberships will open for 25/26 on 8th August.

Achiever Awards – Have been commended for having 9 nominations for Lancashire members. Considering other counties have rallied and ensured they have had a certain number of entries (and Hannah didn't realise this was allowed!), this is really good representation for Lancashire. Hannah will confirm when nominees are likely to hear if they have been successful.

Placing cards – Hannah provided draft prints for approval and asked if all are happy for One Ash to sponsor and cover all the printing costs again. After some discussion the drafts were approved and it was agreed that One Ash sponsorship would be happily accepted.

Club AGM dates - Please can each club let inform Hannah of where and when their AGM will be by 31st August. Hannah made all aware there will be a new 'new officer form' which will be due by the end of October.

H&S – Will now add H&S to every meeting.

Other Communications

Will need to decide what to do with Great Eccleston Show money raised alongside Compass Fuels.

It was posed that we use it towards prizes for Royal Lancs Stockjudging as are having issues getting the prize money for Royal Lancs Show, it hasn't materialised again this year. It was discussed that it is awkward as they offer the prize money as a gift, but are having issues generally with communications and they didn't deliver on this last year either. It was reiterated that we need to assess whole show and LFYFC participation for next year. It was suggested that we give 2 weeks to see if money materialises and then consider using the money raised at Great Eccleston Show. But, it was also felt that we maybe shouldn't be suing money raised at one show to fund another. Beth will follow up with Royal Lancs and the Great Eccleston Money will just go in LFYFC funds until a decision on it sue is made.

Compass fuels want to be our main sponsor. A lot of discussion was had and the following points raised:

- They have helped us raise over £1,000 at The Great Eccleston Show and we wouldn't be able to be there without them.
- Their lead person is a good person to go to for help, but is it a big ask for £1,000 per year to be main county sponsor versus what other sponsors are paying just for one event and comparatively little in return.
- With the extra's offered and repeat partnership fundraising at Great Eccleston Show, it would be more like £2,000 a year.
- Felt we would need to be made clear that we get main sponsors for different events and they would need to be acknowledged properly too. Must make sure our long term sponsors are looked after moving forward.

It was agreed that we need to go back to him with clear response on what is ok, that we appreciate the offer, but if want to main supporter will possibly need a little more from them.

Hannah will arrange a meeting, Ana and Hannah will attend.

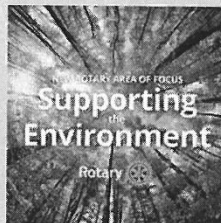
Rotary & Agriculture are inextricably linked with are concerns for the local communities and our environment.

Naturally, there will be mutual benefits, with increased pollination, as well as maintaining a wonderful landscape for future generations.

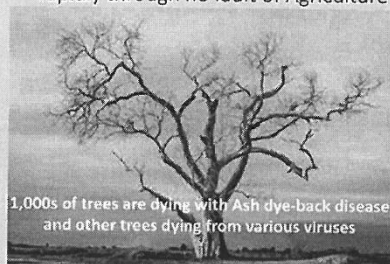
The Country relies upon you guys for food production, but clearly you are also expected to be conservationists. So, can we help.

As custodians of the Land, you know how important our Environment and Landscape is?



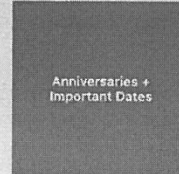
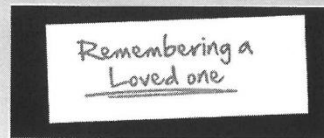
So, here's an idea for you to consider, as a club or your County or District

Alternatively, have you a small area of unproductive land that could support these sorts of trees, on-bloc?

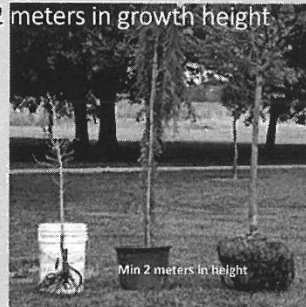

Shadow planting with decent sized, mixed varieties of trees, to suit the soil type and location; with a min requirement of 2 meters in growth height

The details to be worked out & agreed, with farmers & Landowners who would like to participate. (Possibly with MOU)

- Cost to be considered of say £300/tree, for the farmer or Landowner.
- Planted in areas where trees are dead or dying; hedgerows or specimen trees (Where they might have been previously in a hedgerow) e.g. Borders of fields on roadsides, lane sides, bridleways, or footpaths, etc.
- An agreement on types of tree to match soil types, and local climate; perhaps taking advice from the Woodland Trust.
- No metal/plastic plaques or other potential hazards for livestock
- Landowner's agreement to fence appropriately against livestock damage; say for min 3 years.

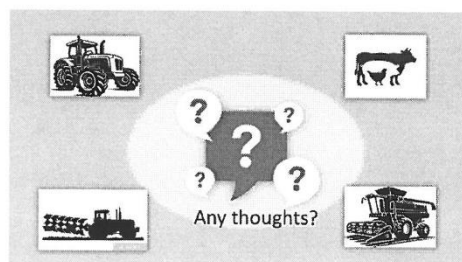

Stranraer and Rhins YFC

Looking for Young Farmer's clubs keen to participate in a Club Exchange
