4. County Chairman's Report, to include Audited Balance Sheet for 2024/25

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Ana Haworth, Chairmans report

Good evening fellow Young Farmers, honoured guests, ladies and gentlemen. As I stand here tonight it feels like only yesterday that I stepped into the role of County Chairwoman. What I didn't know at the time was just how much this year were challenged me shape me and make me prouder than ever to be part of Lancashire YFC. These last few years have not been easy. We have faced obstacles as a county - from operating without a member of staff for part of the year to getting to meet back in our own office. But, together as a federation we refuse to let anything hold us back and tonight I want to celebrate all that we have achieved as a Federation. We didn't just steady the ship, we moved it forward. We have recruited, rebuilt, supported each other and showed what true resilience in young farmers looks like.

I'm incredibly proud that during my time as chairman, we moved from a different position, that wasn't done by one person. That was all of us; officers, club leaders, members, volunteers, advisory and supporters all pulling in the same direction.

When I look back over the last 12 months, we have done an unbelievable amount as a County! The year kicked off with the county debate competition final, Chipping versus Winmarleigh. With members stepping up, sharpening their thinking and proving that Lancashire aren't afraid to have an opinion... or 10! Winmarleigh managed to take the win, leaving Harry Salisbury happy to end his YFC career on a high!

What feels like the biggest challenge of the last 18 months was operating without a member of staff, the uncertainty, the juggling, and making sure what needed to be done was completed. Interviews started in early December for a new member of staff, and we finally found stability in the form of Hannah Rose. We began 2025 with a spring in our step and I couldn't thank Hannah enough as she has genuinely made my year better. Another person I would have struggled over the last year without is Anna Robinson, our Vice Chair, you've been a great support, and it's been easier with you by my side. Simon, as President you've been here for us throughout the year too, you've always been at the end of the phone.

There have been plenty of tractor runs over the Christmas period to raise money for all sorts of good causes, Turton managed to raise a huge £12,000 and Clitheroe, over £10,000 for Yellow Wellies.



Julie Bennett kindly volunteered to write all the heats for our county quiz competition, although the questions were quite hard and left us scratching our heads. The Final saw Andy from Lancashire Wildlife Trust sponsor the event and be our quiz master for the evening. Bilborrow took the win for the juniors and Chipping for the seniors.

There have been plenty of dinner dances across the county over the year: Slaidburn hosted their 90th anniversary dinner, making them one of the oldest clubs in the county. Chorley hosted their annual dinner dance with a great turn out from across the county. We held our annual County Ball at the Bolton Wanderers Stadium, welcoming around 250 members and past members from all corners of Lancashire, a proper celebration of everything we've achieved.

Northern area weekend, a weekend of sports, public speaking, panto and socialising with our northern counterparts. We booked 3 venues and every single one let us down or didn't have the facilities we needed. But we persevered, kept planning, and eventually ended up bringing the whole of northern area to Bacup in the Pennine region. Not quite the original plan, but very on brand for YFC; stressful, chaotic, last minute, and brilliant in the end. We even managed to turn a profit with the help of our northern area night do, hosted in a nightclub in Burnley Town Centre. It was an eye opener to say the least, but a good night was had by all.

A huge thank you to Pete, for being Northern Area Weekend Chair, even though I proposed you for the role when you weren't there to say no. You did a great job for the weekend. Thank you for all your support whilst I've been county chair too, I wouldn't have been able to do it without you!

A special mention to Bury and Parbold for taking on the after dinner speaking this year, it's amazing how a competition designed to test confidence and communication also seemed to bring people a little closer together.

We headed to Myerscough for County Rally this year, hosted by North Lancs region. It was a day filled with sunshine enthusiasm. The timetable went on with an array of quirky competitions to keep us all entertained, from ugly sisters to questionable karaoke. The day ended on a high for Vale who took home the win! A special thanks to North Lancs County Rally committee for organising the day.

If there is one thing Lancashire clubs are good at, it is raising money. A phenomenal amount has been raised for all sorts of charities this year. Pendle's Speed Shear took place once again raising a huge £17,000 for Lyme disease, Yellow Wellies and Sepsis UK. Longridge have just hosted A Dyno Day raising £13,000.

Bonfire night is another key event in the YFC calendar, with clubs pulling together for food and a get together. Bolton by Bowland hosted Bowland regions bonfire once again, with a cracking night of fireworks, pie and peas supper and proper community spirit, which is what YFC is all about.

A couple of weeks ago 16 of you from across the county; Slaidburn, Rainford, Bury and Samlesbury (to name a few), went to the English winter fair to compete in the Live and Carcass competition. Arry Young from Bury and Erin Wright from Samlesbury managed to bag a National trophy. The last competition before Christmas took place this week. 14 of the 15 clubs rocked up to Red Rose Bowl and gave it their best shot for the bowling competition. Rainford took the lead winning overall.

I've had the privilege of representing Lancashire at county level, national level and being part of some unforgettable moments; competitions, rallies, county events, northern area weekend, and all the



times our members have shown with their talent, humour and sheer passion for YFC. It's been a busy year to say the least! But the absolute highlight has been you. Every club I visited, every message I've received, every conversation at meetings or events, you've reminded me why YFC is so special. Lancashire is full of leaders, of doers and of people who care. And it has been an honour to be someone you could come to for guidance, support, or even just a moan. I promised when I took on this role I would lead with integrity, transparency, and a commitment to our federation. I hope I've done that. And I hope I've shown that you don't have to be the loudest person in the room to make a difference, you just have to care deeply enough to keep going even when it's hard.

As I step down tonight I do so with a full heart. I am grateful, I'm proud and I am excited for the future of Lancashire YFC. Our next county officers will bring new ideas, new energy, and new passion. And I will be standing behind them every step of the way cheering them on.

Thank you, young farmers, for trusting me, challenging me, supporting me and for making this one of the most meaningful years of my life. Thank you.

Ana's highlights of the accounts:

- Finished with surplus of £8,525
- Income was up across the board, total £94,501.
- Affiliation fees increased.
- Event income doubled.
- Interest on reserves continues to support us.
- Expenditure slightly higher than last year at £85,976.
- Increase in staffing costs and National levy.
- Reduced overspend in other areas.
- Currently hold £243,309 in reserves covering keeping well above the 3-monthly running cost threshold.
- Far healthier position for next year.

a. Northwest Auction presentation

Jill Wilde and John Garnett, directors of Northwest auctions introduced themselves. They discussed their decision to provide sponsorship and why they decided to give LFYFC money.

The organisation had been appalled at lack of recent support to farming communities and the discretionary YFC grant for research being pulled. They made decision to make a long-term pledge to Lancashire and Cumbria YFC. NWA want to welcome young farmers, for them to feel valued and for NWA venues to be seen as somewhere they can always feel welcome and supported. They want to promote training and the sense of community in YFC.

It is hoped that their commitment shines a ray of light in a gloomy situation and that the government come to their senses in terms of recent policies.

They hope that this will help LFYFC to go from strength to strength.

Presented cheque for £2,500, Ana thanked them for their annual sponsorship.

It has been a great year of events and competitions. Lots of clubs having their fabulous dinner dances and memorable nights.

There are two things he wants to say to all young farmers and get the maximum out of being a young farmer. Don't go into it half-hearted and don't leave with regrets. Feels that it is important no one misses out on being a young farmer. Over the years, we have lost quite a few clubs, especially around the county periphery. He would like to start conversations with people about the longevity of clubs. He concluded that he feels it is a great time to be part of a YFC organisation.
